Intentional Evangelism

January 9th, after dinner, we watched our program "Apostles of Comedy". After a few shared their Christian thoughts embellished with comedy, J John shared some thoughts that have stuck with me and had a meaning I need to consider as a Christian member of our church. It was really a wake up call all of us at Christ Memorial need to consider seriously. Our lack of church growth is a fact that all of us need to ask ourselves; How can I help? I think J John gave us an answer. Years ago when we first came to CMBC, we had prayer meeting every Wednesday night, and then many of us followed that with visiting those we invited to join our church.

Our culture has changed in 50 years and I'm not suggesting that, but there are things we can do and must do if we hope to reverse our loss of membership.

J John called it Intentional Evangelism. The Apostle Peter says it the same way when he says "But always revere Christ as Lord. Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope you have. But do this with gentleness and respect." To me, they both are saying we should anticipate our opportunity to share our faith whenever the time, and whatever the situation. It might mean what we say to a clerk at Lowes, a waitress at dinner, a nurse at the hospital, your mechanic, a fellow student, or maybe a family member or our neighbor. If we faithfully reach out to whomever and whenever possible, God will take care of our numbers.

That is Intentional Evangelism.



A Challenge from Pastor Jeff

PRAY: I Dare You!

People often say, "Don't pray for patience, because God teaches us patience by trying our patience." So, if we don't pray for it, we won't have to put up with the trials that might come our way, which help us to develop a patient spirit. We don't want to be patient in the first place. We want instant gratification. So we don't pray for patience. Instead, we shut out what God is trying to do in our lives. We don't want anything from God that might take effort or require suffering from us.

That's our old nature coming out. We don't want God to change us. We don't want to submit to His will for us. But if we are truly going to follow Christ, we are required to surrender ourselves fully to what God wants to do in our lives (note: I am not saying we *desire* this, but that we need to trust what God desires for us). We are being conformed to the likeness of Christ (Romans 8:29), not vice versa. And we will have to *fight* our old nature every step of the way as God works to make it happen.

Do we claim Christ as Lord, yet still assert our own will be done? Or, can we say with Paul: "I want to know Christ—yes, to know the power of his resurrection and participation in his sufferings, becoming like him in his death, and so, somehow, attaining to the resurrection from the dead (Philippians 3:10-11)."

I believe that there are certain things we know God wants, yet we refuse to pray for them because we're afraid that God will actually do them. Maybe, if we can *own* our feelings, we can overcome our hesitancy.

Exhibit A: Jesus says to His disciples: "The harvest is plentiful but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field (Matthew 9:37–38)." He said this because He had compassion on the crowds of people who came to Him because "they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd (Matthew 9:36)." He cared about the lost. He yearned to reach them and bring them into the Kingdom.

So... do we pray for workers in God's harvest field? I fear that we don't... because we fear that He will... and when He does, it may be us he sends... and we don't want to go! I dare you to prove me wrong! (He told me to say it!)

During the upcoming Lenten season we are preparing strategic opportunities for *you* to pray for the lost in our/your community. I invite you – no, I challenge you – to commit yourself to look out onto the fields of harvest in our community and pray that the Lord of the Harvest will send workers into His field. I challenge you to ask God to show you what He wants to do in our community. I challenge you to listen closely to how God may be leading *you* to take action in response to what He shows you.

Are you willing? Do you dare to risk that God will answer?

GO DEEPER IN LENT

CMBC's leadership invites you to join them in **specific strategic prayer** for our neighborhoods, communities and the church this Lenten period. While this prayer emphasis will officially take place in March and April, our church leadership is starting now and you are welcome to join them.

- On Ash Wednesday, March 6th worshippers will be invited to come by the church in the morning to observe a brief, private devotion of commitment in the Sanctuary and ashes will be placed on the forehead of those who wish to receive them.
- On Sunday Mornings in Lent, those who are willing to commit to pray will attend one worship service and spend time in prayer during the opposite worship service.
- Individuals and Prayer Teams will commit to daily prayer for specific neighborhoods and communities. A prayer map will be posted at the church to allow participants to choose the area they wish to cover in prayer.
- "PRAY4DOVER Prayer gatherings will be held at 4pm each Sunday in Lent. Those who cannot attend in person will be encouraged to join us by taking even a few minutes to pray at 4pm each week.

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, March 6, 2019 and ends with Palm Sunday, March 14, 2019 (which is the beginning of Holy Week). Traditionally, Lent has been a period in which to deepen one's commitment to Christ (often by practicing spiritual disciplines, like fasting and prayer, etc.). While many associate these practices with the Roman Catholic Church, they are practiced by many denominations, including many Baptists. The beauty of a 'free church' tradition is that we can adopt any traditions which we feel that God would have us use for a time. Prayer is one of the most foundational spiritual practices and we hope to use the opportunity that Lent provides to strengthen our prayer lives.



Our Christmas Child has arrived. Have you seen him/her? Have you handed in a name? We will let you know in March when a name has been chosen. Also,

check out the sign board that the Christmas Child is holding to find out the item of the month that is needed. The children that receive thes gifts will know that someone cares. Your generosity will bless them and you.
