




Bill Clemmer Interviewed by CBS News on Ebola Crisis in Eastern DRC

International Ministries (IM) has received word that IM global servant Dr. Bill Clemmer is being interviewed today by a team from the CBS Evening News for a series of reports that the news agency is currently broadcasting about the ongoing outbreak of the Ebola virus in the eastern Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC).

Clemmer is a medical doctor who, with his wife Ann, has served through IM for more than 25 years providing medical care in some of the most challenging situations and circumstances in the world. He is currently serving with IM's partner IMA World Health, leading an international team of doctors, nurses, and technical personnel responding to the crisis. Now the second-deadliest Ebola outbreak in history, the medical response is greatly complicated by the breakdown of trust in government and international institutions and the activity of numerous armed militia groups, which has included violent attacks targeting medical personnel engaged in the containment of the virus and treatment of patients.

Clemmer is safe and IM continues to be in regular contact with him while closely monitoring the situation. IM encourages churches, friends and supporters to pray fervently for the Clemmers and others engaged in ministry in the DRC and to share news and concern for the Clemmers with sensitivity to the safety and security issues surrounding their work.
