

PRAYER & WITNESS IN LENT

CMBC's leadership invites you to join them in **specific strategic prayer** for our neighborhoods, communities and the church this Lenten period. This prayer emphasis will officially take place during the 40 days of lent, from March 6th to April 14^{th.} Our church leadership has already started praying and you are encouraged to join them.

Traditionally, Lent has been a period in which to deepen one's commitment to Christ (often by practicing spiritual disciplines, like fasting and prayer, etc.). While many associate these practices with the Roman Catholic Church, they are practiced by many denominations, including many Baptists. The beauty of a 'free church' tradition is that we can adopt any traditions we feel that God would have us use. Prayer is one of the most foundational spiritual practices and we hope to use the opportunity Lent provides to strengthen our prayer lives and to pray for God to help us be effective in witnessing to others.

Ash Wednesday Devotions & Ashes

You have probably noticed people with ashes on their foreheads on Ash Wednesday. It is pretty clear, at that point, that they are associated with a church; *religious* people. But have you ever thought about the open door to witness created by those ashes? When people ask, you can share that the ashes are a sign that you follow Jesus, who suffered and died for your sins and rose from the dead. If they ask, "Are you Catholic?" You can reply, "I'm not Catholic, But I am a follower of Christ and, as a Baptist, we also observe Lent as a period to grow closer to God."

On Ash Wednesday, March 6th worshippers are invited to come by the church in the morning to observe a brief, private devotion of commitment in the Sanctuary and ashes will be placed on the forehead of those who wish to receive them. The ashes will be produced by burning the prayer notes that have been placed in the Prayer Bible at the back of the Sanctuary.

For us, the ashes will symbolize penitence; a sorrow for personal sin. These are a fitting way to begin Lent as we reflect on the suffering and death of Christ, which was necessary because of sin. When Job had an encounter with God, his response was: "My ears had heard of you but now my eyes have seen you. Therefore I despise myself and repent in dust and ashes (Job 42:5–6)."

This is an unusual opportunity for our church, since we have never done it before, but we expect that it will be meaningful and will glorify God through our public witness. We look forward to hearing the stories of how God uses you because of the ashes!

Sunday Prayer Warriors

On Sunday Mornings in Lent, we are looking for those who are willing to commit to pray for a worship service while it is happening. Pray-ers will attend one worship service and spend time in prayer during the opposite worship service. A Guide will be provided to direct individual or group prayer, which will take place in the Serendipity Library each Sunday in Lent. A signup sheet is in the Communication Room at church. Feel free to share in this prayer ministry either every Sunday or even just one Sunday morning.

Charles Spurgeon, the great British preacher, enjoyed a powerful ministry that reached many people. When he gave a tour of the church facility he would show people the furnace room. It wasn't the heating system, but a room full of people who were actively praying for the worship services while they were going on. As we look to grow in our prayer and witness during this Lenten season, let's commit to prayer, that we might rejoice to see how God answers prayer!

Daily Prayer Strategy

Individuals and Prayer Teams will commit to daily prayer for specific neighborhoods and communities. A prayer map will be posted at the church to allow participants to choose the area they wish to cover in prayer. We suggest making a "prayer walk" through the community you have committed to pray for, lifting up each home and asking God to reach them with the good news of salvation!

These gatherings will involve testimonies of how God is answering prayer among us as well as lifting up prayers together for our local and worldwide communities.


